Lisbon is Portugal's capital, located in the west part of the country, where the River Tagus flows into the Atlantic Ocean. Many civilizations have found the hills of Lisbon a the perfect place to settle, which micro climate and strategic location, allowed its prosperity, becoming one of the most richest Cities and the main trade center in Europe during the 15th and 16th century. Today Lisbon is a lively international city, considered among the most cultural, fun and exciting Cities in Europe to be experienced. Portuguese Discoveries Monumental Tour

09:00am - Departing from the hotel by coach towards Belem quarter, one of the most noble areas of the city reflecting the birth of a new Era, during which, Portugal had an important role. With most monuments and buildings dating from the 15th and 16th century, considered among the finest examples of the Gothic-Naturalist.

The Monument to the Portuguese Discoveries and Belem Tower are considered two of the most well known trade marks of Lisbon, and obviously deserving a stop for a memorable group photo.

Built in the 1500's the Jeronimos Monastery (Hieronymite Monks) church, with its main-altar in Gothic-Renaissance style, houses the beautiful tombs of Luis de Camões (The Portuguese Poet that wrote about the Portuguese epopee)", Vasco da Gama (The Navigator that discovered the sea route to India) and King's Manuel Dynasty. Visit the church.

Inevitable is the short stop for a coffee break at one of the oldest and most famous pastry shops of Lisbon, to taste the local Belem Pastry. Selling over 5,000 units p/day, this old traditional recipe, is one of the family's owner most well kept secret.

Continue the tour to visit the interesting Maritime Museum, one of the most important in Europe, evoking Portugal's domination of the seas. Its colossal 17,000 items are installed in the west wing of Jeronimos Monastery, and include model ships from the Age of Discovery onward. The oldest exhibit is a wooden figure representing the Archangel Raphael that accompanied Vasco da Gama on his voyage to India.

Board the bus on a panoramic drive through downtown Lisbon.

01:00pm - Lunch will be served at the Restaurant Olivier Avenida. The chandeliers, the mirrors and the pearls provide the place with a luxurious and cosmopolitan ambiance. The daylight which comes from the huge windows reflects the golden beams. At Olivier Avenida you are in the very heart of a trendy, urban and cosmopolitan Lisbon. This place was conceived by Chef Olivier and decorated by Sofia Costa.

Option A) Gulbenkian Museum

Departure from the hotel towards the "New Avenues" of Lisbon, as the Financial area of Lisbon is also known, where the Foundation Calouste Gulbenkian is located. Calouste Gulbenkian was an Armenian business man that owned 5% of the Irak Petroleum Company. Before his death, he donated to Portugal a great fortune, that was used to create a foundation. Modern buildings, that house the immense art collection that Calouste Gulbenkian got together during some decades, within beautiful gardens in which several species of fauna can be found (including exotic ones).

The Museum houses on the permanent exhibition galleries 1000 of its most representative works. A short selection choice of the most outstanding pieces in the Calouste Gulbenkian Museum belonging to different sections are presented here, such as Egyptian Art, Greco-Roman Art, Sculpture, Painting, decorative art. After visiting the Museum, guests will have time at leisure to explore the Gulbenkian Gardens.

Option B) National Tile Museum

This delightful museum is well worth a visit, presenting five centuries of decorative ceramic tiles ("azulejos"), tracing the history and production of the art form.

Its collection is the only of its kind in the world, and contains a splendid array of tiles from as early as the 15th century along with displays on how they're made. It is housed in the monastic buildings of the Madre de Deus Convent, which after renovation following the Great Earthquake had its interior turned into one of the most magnificent in the city. The splendor and opulence of the chapel dedicated to St. Anthony and the chapter house is particularly impressive.

The highlight of the museum is a blue and white composition of 1300 tiles, 23m (75ft) in length, of Lisbon's cityscape made in 1738, prior to the Great Earthquake, and reputedly the country's longest tile piece.

Option C) Queluz National Palace

Departing from the hotel by bus, guests will be heading towards Queluz, for a visit to the Royal Palace. The Royal chambers, the Music and the Throne-room, the Ambassadors room as well as splendid halls and gardens are worth visiting due to the beauty of the 18th Century furniture, decoration, glazed-tiles wall panels and Brazilian wood parquet floors. Presently this Palace is the official residence of all foreign Kings or Presidents on state visit to Portugal. It is considered to be a miniature Versailles.

Option D) Architecture Tour of Lisbon

Departure from the hotel by bus, on a panoramic drive by the Marques de Pombal square and Downtown, to observe the influence of the Pombaline architectural style from the 18th century. Downtown was completely rebuilt after the great earthquake of 1755, marked by plain houses, wide avenues, neoclassical buildings. This was Europe's first great example of neoclassical design and urban planning, and one of the finest European architectural achievements of the age.

Continue driving along the river towards Alcantara, from where it can be seen the 25th April Bridge over Tagus River, considered one of the longest suspension bridges in central Europe and often compared with San Francisco's Golden Gate Bridge due to a similar appearance.

Guests will observe the beautiful architecture of the Aqueduct and drive under its arches which will give a great perspective of the Aqueduct. With its impressive height, the "Águas Livres" Aqueduct is the most remarkable and complex hydraulic engineering water supply systems of the 18th century, and an interesting attraction. Built in 1746 to bring the city its first clean drinking water, Lisbon's remarkable aqueduct is made up of 109 stone arches, which were the tallest stone arches in the world when they were built. It is possible to walk across the aqueduct's both walkways, quietly and without any effort. During the walk, you are able to cross the aqueduct from one path to another and see the tunnel where the waters would flow to Lisbon. The views are amazing on both sides: the bridge, the river, Monsanto Park and the city's urban sprawl.

Proceed to the eastern side of Lisbon, the place where the last World Exhibition of the 20th century took place - the Expo'98. Nowadays, it concentrates some of the most daring contemporary architecture structures, which will certainly surprise guests when comparing with the historical quarters.

We suggest a panoramic sight of this district by cable car, which offers a great perspective of the greatest architecture constructions in the area, such as the Vasco da Gama Bridge, Portugal Pavillion by Siza Vieira, Peter Chermayeff's Oceanarium, Santianto Calatrava's extraordinary train station.

Return to the hotel by bus.

Option F) Wine Tasting

In 2002 it was proclaimed as a National Monument. From the Sao Pedro de Alcantara Belvedere guests will enjoy a panoramic view over the St. George's Castle and downtown.

Wine Bar in Bairro Alto:

» Availability: Sep. 19 (afternoon) - available / Sep. 20 (morning & afternoon) - available The popular Bairro Alto quarter is just across the street, an old quarter featuring coloured buildings, making this district one of the most picturesque of the city.

Walk through the narrow streets that will lead to the wine bar, where guests will taste the Portuguese wines and traditional tapas, being explained how the wines combine perfectly with the Portuguese delicacies.

Option G) History of Jews in Portugal

It was between the 5th and the 15th century that the Jewish community established itself in Portugal, contributing in different ways and within the space of ten centuries to the flourishing of Portuguese culture. Many members of this community, which included philosophers, humanists, scientists and dealers, were protected by the monarchy and participated in an active way in paramount moments of Portuguese history.

Departure from the hotel for a tour focused on the Jewish influence in the city, featuring the Marques de Pombal square, Liberdade Avenue, Rossio Square where in its north side existed, up to the 18th century, the Estãos Palace - headquarter if the Inquisition Court in Lisbon. Continuation to Conceição and Madalena streets, where stand two of the main Jewish quarters of Lisbon, on the way to Saint George Castle set on the top of the hill, from where it is possible to enjoy one of the most magnificent views over the city of Lisbon.

Walk down along the Alfama quarter, including the Jewish Street, remaining of what has been the third Jewish quarter within the walls of medieval Lisbon.

Thursday - Visit to the Synagogue

Continue the tour to the place of the actual Synagogue in Lisbon Shaare Tiekwa. Built by donations of the Lisbon Jewish colony in 1904, whose architect was Ventura Terra. The façade shows a mixture of several motives from different styles, with ten high fists with stained glass windows. At the interior paintings from Veloso Salgado can be seen as well as a magnificent silver lamp by Christofanetti.

Friday - Visit to the Ruins of Carmo Convent:

Proceed then to the Ruins of Carmo Convent, where guests can find three tombstones with Hebrew inscriptions one of them dating back to century 6 A.D.

Return to the hotel.

Located in a slope of the Mountain of Sintra the National Palace of Sintra, which will be visited, was the residence of many Portuguese Kings as from the 14th Century. Beautiful tiles, painted ceilings and centuries old walls, as well as an unusually huge kitchen. Guests will have the opportunity to enjoy some leisure time in Sintra Historical Quarter, and the opportunity to stroll along its charming narrow streets, full of small shops, where beautiful tiles, ceramics and handicrafts can be found.

Lunch will be served at Restaurant Hotel Central, located in the heart of Sintra, in front of the Sintra National Palace.

After lunch, descending the ever-green mountain continue to Cape Roca, the Western-most point of continental Europe, a stop will be made by the cliffs over the Atlantic Ocean.

Continue through Guincho Beach and arrive at the old fishermen village of Cascais that in the 1940's was chosen as residence by the exiled European Royalty, a stop will be made by the lovely bay filled with fishing boats.


