MINUTES

of the

Real Property, Probate and Trust Law Section

EXECUTIVE COUNCIL MEETING

September 30, 2006

Gaylord Palms, Kissimmee, Florida

Rohan Kelley, Section Chair, presiding

- I. Presiding** - The Section Chair, Rohan Kelley, called the meeting to order at 10:30 a.m.
- II. Attendance** – George J. Meyer, Secretary.

The attendance roster was circulated by the Secretary to be initialed by Council members in attendance at the meeting. Attendance is shown cumulatively on circulated attendance rosters. It is the responsibility of the Council member to promptly bring any corrections to the attention of the Secretary. The cumulative attendance roster to date for the 2006-2007 Bar year is attached to these Minutes.

- III. Minutes of Previous Meeting** – George J. Meyer, Secretary.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, the Minutes of the Executive Council meeting held in Palm Beach on August 12, 2006, included in the agenda package at pages 1-20, were approved with certain corrections to the attendance record.

- IV. Chair's Report** – Rohan Kelley, Chair.

Rohan's report included the following items:

- 1.** The establishment of the Membership Diversity Committee and the appointment of Tae Bronner and Kenneth Walton as its Co-Chairs. Rohan stressed the importance of increasing minority participation in both the Section's general membership and the Section's Executive Council.
- 2.** Rohan reported on the efforts that have been made to update the Executive Council's Roster and the development of an application process for those seeking membership on the Executive Council. He reported that Charlie Nash is heading up a special committee that is developing an application form that will reflect the general expectations and goals of Executive Council members.
- 3.** Rohan stated that he wished to update the Section's website to include a listing for those Section members who are authorized to practice law in other states.

4. Rohan reported on the generally good continuing relationship existing between the Section and The Florida Bar's leadership. Rohan expressed his wish and intention to continue to improve that relationship.
5. Rohan stated he would like to see the Section's visibility at other Bar functions increased. He discussed the possibility of having Section shirts that could be worn so as to easily identify Section members at other Bar functions.
6. Rohan raised the issue of the escalating costs associated with attending the Section's Executive Council meetings. He expressed the desire of the Executive Committee to monitor and control those costs. There was general discussion concerning possible alternatives for controlling and/or reducing such costs. It was decided that a special committee would be formed to look further into this issue.

VI. Liaison with Board of Governors Report – Gwynne Young.

Laird Lile reported on the amicable resolution of the Out of State legislative issue. He also reported that the Board of Governors has decided to support Amendment No. 3 to the State Constitution (i.e., requiring a 60% vote for future amendments to the State's Constitution). He also reported on the website advertising issue that is presently before the Board of Governors. He concluded by noting that the diversity issue raised by Rohan in his report is a very high profile issue within the Board of Governors.

VII. Treasurer's Report – Wm. Fletcher Belcher, Treasurer.

1. Year-to-Date Summary at pp. 23-27 of the Agenda materials.

As reflected in the Financial Summary portion of the Treasurer's Report, Fletcher reported that, as of August 31, 2006, revenue was \$400,556.00 (\$55,000.00 of which came from sponsors), expenses were \$72,508.00, net income was \$328,048.00, and the balance on hand was \$776,121.00.

VIII. Circuit Representative's Report - Margaret Rolando, Director

1. Peggy reported that Dave Brennan had made a presentation at the Circuit Representatives meeting concerning the new mentoring program for young and new lawyers. She also stated that Laura Sundberg had made a presentation concerning sponsorship appreciation. Finally, she reported the Circuit Representatives are hoping to shortly get all of their various Circuit listservs up and running.

IX. Real Property Law Division – John Neukamm, Director.

Action Items:

1. FLTA Critique of OIR's Title Insurance Rate Studies
[Title Insurance Committee – Homer Duvall] pp. 28-50

The Title Insurance Committee recommended that the Section adopt the report commissioned by the Florida Land Title Association, prepared by Robert B. Scherer, and entitled “A review and critique of “An analysis of Florida’s Title Insurance Market” issued by the Florida Office of Insurance Regulation in July, 2006,” as the Section’s position on the three studies of title insurance rates, published by the Florida Office of Insurance Regulation. The Committee’s motion was adopted by unanimous approval. Further, the Committee’s motions to find this matter was within the Section’s purview and to authorize the expenditure of Section funds in support of this position were unanimously approved.

2. Ratification of Executive Committee’s Action with respect to Proposed Amendment to *Rule 1.221*
[Mobile Homes & RV Parks Committee – David Eastman] pp. 51-55

The motion made by the Mobile Homes and RV Parks Committee for the Executive Council to ratify the action taken by the Executive Committee with respect to proposed amendment to Rule 1.221, was unanimously approved.

3. Duplicate Names Proposal
[Real Property Problem Study Committee – Brian Leebrick] pp. 56-62

The Real Property Problems Study Committee’s motion to seek amendment to Section 608.406 to require that limited liability company names be distinguishable was unanimously approved. Also, the Committee’s motions to find this legislative effort to be within the Section’s purview and to authorize the Section to expend funds in support of this legislative change, were unanimously approved.

4. Commercial Real Estate Lien Act Forms
[Real Property Forms Committee – Mike Pyle] pp. 63-90

The Real Property Forms Committee’s motion for the Section to approve and adopt the various broker lien forms set forth in the agenda material was unanimously approved.

5. Land Trust Act Amendments
[Land Trusts & REITS Committee – Katherine Frazier] pp. 91-95

The Land Trusts & REITS Committee’s motion to amend the Florida Land Trust Act to conform existing cross-references with the new Florida Trust Code was unanimously passed. Further, the Committee’s motions for the Section to find this legislative activity to be within the Section’s purview and to authorize expenditure of Section’s funds to support this legislative action, were unanimously approved.

6. Cancellation of Mortgages Glitch Bill.

The Real Property Problem Study's Committee moved for waiver of the rules to allow it to propose a motion concerning a glitch bill with respect to Section 701.04. The Committee's motion to waive the rules was unanimously approved. After a discussion concerning the proposed changes to Section 701.04, the Committee moved that the Section seek legislation to amend Section 701.04. The Committee's motion was unanimously approved. Further, the Committee's motions to find that this legislative action was within the Section's purview and for the Section to authorize funds to be expended in support of this legislative action, were unanimously approved.

7. The FAR/BAR Committee made a motion to waive the rules to allow it to make a motion that the Section file an amicus brief with respect to the Mortenson v. Gates case. The Committee's motion was unanimously passed. There was then general discussion concerning the issue raised in the subject case. The Committee moved that the Section's Amicus Committee file an amicus brief on behalf of the Section in support of the position that two witnesses are not required on a purchase and sale agreement for homestead property. The Committee's motion was passed by majority vote. Also, the Committee's motions that this action was within the Section's purview and that the Section should expend funds in support of it were passed.

The Committee's motions to find this action to be within with the Section's purview and to authorize the Section to expend funds in support of that action were passed.

2. Revisions to Fla. Stat. 733.620 to permit exculpation of the Personal Representative under a Will
[Probate Litigation – Jack Falk] pp. 101-106

The Committee's motion to seek legislative action to revise Section 733.620 to permit exculpation of the personal representative under a will was unanimously passed. The Committee's motions to find this action to be within the Section's

purview and to authorize the Section to expend funds in support of that action passed unanimously.

3. Revisions to Fla. Stat. 627.404 addressing the concept of an “insurable interest”
[Estate & Trust Tax Planning – Richard Gans] pp. 107-127

The Committee’s motion for the Section to seek legislative action to revise Section 627.404 to address the concept of an insurable interest was unanimously passed. The Committee’s motions to find this action to be within the Section’s purview and to authorize the Section to expend funds on this action were unanimously passed.
